## Reaney v University Hospital of North Staffordshire NHS Trust

The Court of Appeal have now given judgment in Reaney -v- University Hospital of North Staffordshire NHS Trust.

This clarifies the first instance judgment and gives further important guidance on the approach to quantification of damages where the claimant has a pre-existing injury or condition.

The judgment is crucial in understanding how to formulate, and not under-settle, claims for care, accommodation, transportation and therapies.
